Purpose

Thrive For Life's retreats offer classical quality reflective and meditative tools for an examined life. Participating facilities receive monthly newsletters to distribute. According to **St. Ignatius of Loyola**, the Spiritual Exercises are "every way of examining one's conscience, of meditating, of contemplating, of praying vocally and mentally, and of performing other spiritual actions."

Thrive For Life partners with local universities to offer scholarships and referrals to our transitional supportive living community at Ignacio House of Studies. Thrive For Life seeks to expand our partnership with **Georgetown** and **Marquette Universities**.

In order to help individuals secure self-sustaining and meaningful work, Thrive For Life provides employment mentorship and support, including **job workforce training, resume writing, interviewing skills, clothing, and transportation**. Through our partnerships with local employers, resident scholars have access to job referrals and opportunities.

Housing

Resident scholars like Mychal are thriving at **Ignacio House** in the Bronx, New York. With a capacity for 24 residents, the inaugural Ignacio House has been an overwhelming success. Expanding this living community to other cities **across the nation** will have widespread effects on society. Since 2019, 27 resident scholars have been admitted, and not a single scholar has recidivated. In the past two years, 15 scholars have transitioned to **independent living** in permanent, affordable housing.

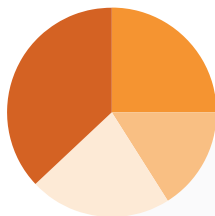

Total Operating Revenue

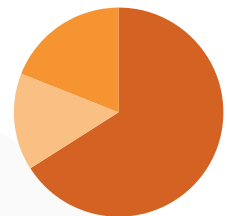

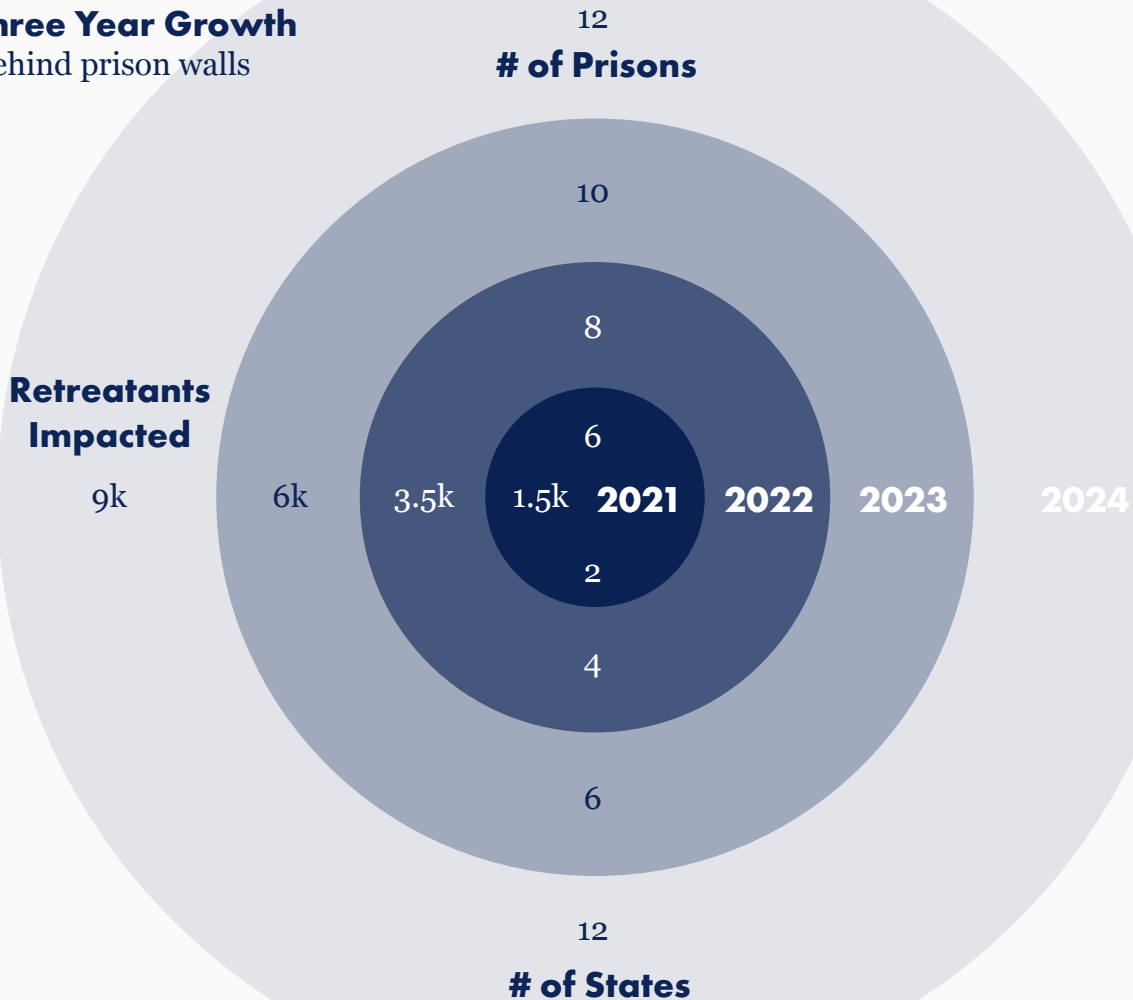

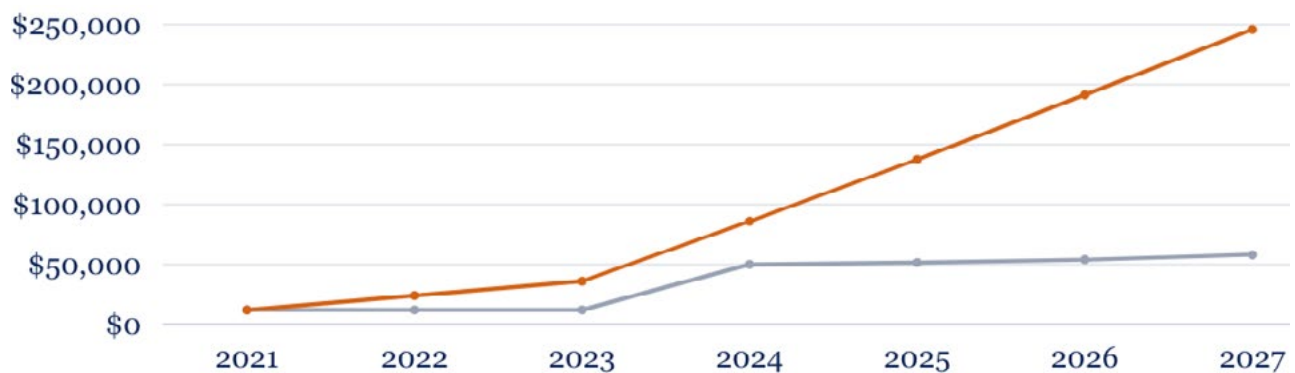

A single cot in the city shelter compared to a safe, stable and supportive living community.

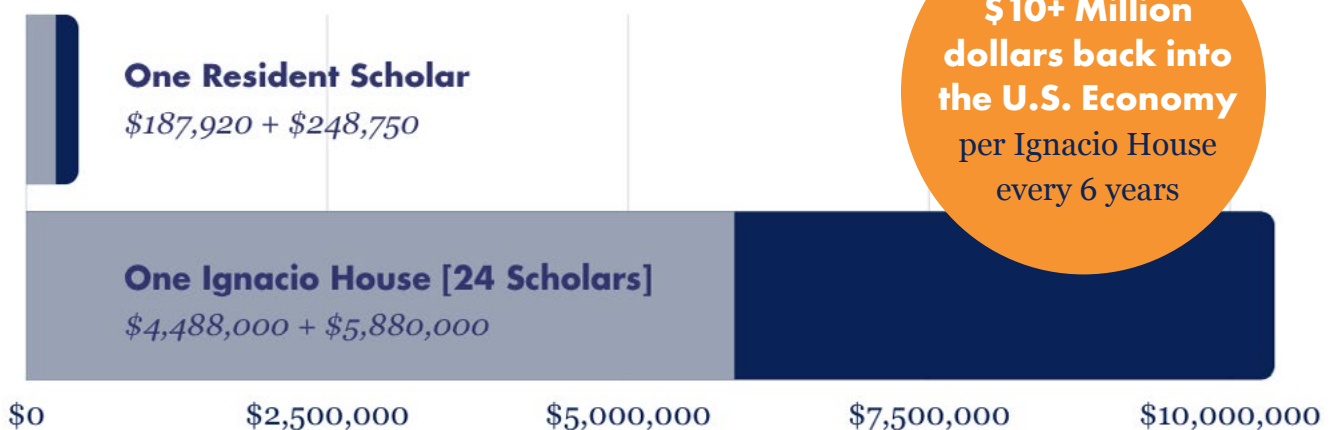
Income Generation
